The Process of creating the first Migration Profile for the United Republic of Tanzania was a joint process led by IOM and an inter-ministerial Task Force chaired by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation.

The Migration Profile for Tanzania contains four main parts: 1) Migration trends and migrant characteristics, 2) Impact of migration, 3) Migration Governance and 4) Key findings, policy implications and recommendations.
